Welcome to Helena Robotics!

Teacher Coaches

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Helena Robotics is a school club that encourages students to develop skills in computer science and mechanical engineering. Our teams participate in the FIRST Robotics competitions. We focus on the FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC), which includes students from grades 7-12 from the Helena area.

Following a sports model, FIRST Tech Challenge teams design, build, program, and operate robots of their own design to play a floor game in an alliance format. Teams also document their entire process in an Engineering Notebook. Engineering Notebooks are digital documents shared with the coaches for supervision and presented to judges at tournaments. Guided by adult Coaches and Mentors, students develop STEM skills and practice engineering principles, while realizing the value of hard work, innovation, and sharing ideas. Participants have access to tens of millions of dollars in college scholarships.

Robotics Season

Season kick-off is in early September when the season's game is announced. The design and build season runs from September to January. Tournament season varies by region and can begin as early as October and continues through April. State and Regional Tournaments advance teams to Super-Regional Championship Tournaments, and winners earn spots at *FIRST* Championship at the end of April. Official tournament dates will be released near the start of the season.

Time Commitment

Being an active team member is a significant time commitment. There are MANDATORY meetings from 1:00-4:00 pm every Sunday of the season. However, as tournaments draw near it is common for our members to spend several additional hours per week after school working on their robots and programs. There is an attendance policy in place for Sunday meetings. Students are allowed 3 excused absences and 0 unexcused absences throughout the season. Subsequent absences result in "benching" at any tournaments following the 4th excused or 1st unexcused absence. In order to have an absence excused, the student or student's parent must contact the coaches or head mentor PRIOR to the start of the Sunday meeting at 1:00 pm. Special circumstances regarding absences may be taken into consideration on a case by case basis. Optional lunch meetings will be held one weekday in Room 202.

Students are also required to complete at least 10 club service hours per season. These hours can include things like helping with concessions, staying after meetings for thorough cleanup, working at our robotics camps, etc. However, the hours do have to be approved by the mentors in order to count. Failure to complete service hours will result in "benching" at tournaments.

Student Fee

The fee for team membership is **\$100** per student per season. This fee is non-refundable. This fee helps toward paying for the cost of team registration, materials, travel, and social activities (pizza parties, video game nights, et cetera). If this fee causes financial hardship, please contact the coaches for assistance.

Safety and Conduct Guidelines

Students are required to wear appropriate personal protective equipment while working on the robots. This includes but may not be limited to: safety glasses, ear plugs, and closed toed shoes. Students must use materials and tools appropriately and safely. Students are not permitted to work in the school without supervision from one of the coaches or another district employee. Repeated violations of any safety guidelines will result in disciplinary action which may include "benching" at tournaments or termination from the club. Helena School District and its employees and FIRST Robotics volunteer coaches and mentors hold no liability for injuries sustained during robotics practice, meetings, or meets.

Students will be held to high standards in terms of personal conduct. Offensive speech and/or actions will not be tolerated. Students are expected to be respectful of school and club property; this includes cleaning and maintaining the space and materials. Students will also behave respectfully toward the coaches and mentors at all times.

Academic Rigor

Students are expected to maintain passing grades in all core classes. Students that are failing core classes may be subject to "benching" or suspension from the club. Special circumstances may be taken into consideration on a case-by-case basis.
